

Crimes in Southfields

Plot the locations of the burglaries on the map overleaf. Then suggest:

- 1. How many offenders are responsible for the burglaries?
- 2. What else might we expect about these offenders?

About halfway down Crescent Gardens
Alverstone Avenue, near the junction with Ashen Grove
Elborough Street near the junction with Revelstoke Road
Elsenham Street, near the junction with Replingham Road
Engadine Street, about midway between Lavenham Road and Revelstoke Road
Engadine Street, Near the junction with Revelstoke Road
Heythorp Street, on the corner with Replingham Road
Near the corner of Home Park Road and Arthur Road
Normanton Avenue, about half way down
Penwith Road, near the junction with Garratt Lane
Pirbright road, near the junction with Wimbledon Park Road
Revelstoke Road, on the corner with Melrose Avenue
Ryfold Road, opposite Farquar Road
The corner of Melrose Avenue and Ryfold Road
Thornsett Road, near the corner with Groton Road
Tranmere road, near the junction with Magdalen Road
Trentham Street, about midway between Lavenham Road and Revelstoke Road
Wimbledon Park Road, on the corner with Gartmoor Gardens
Wolseley Avenue, near the junction with Revelstoke Road

NB: all of these offence locations are entirely fictional; any resemblance with actual events is coincidental. Southfields is actually a very nice place; I only used it because I know the area.

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
